## 1. Roll call of the delegates, approval of the Agenda.

The President welcomes the 63 delegates present. He states that the 2nd IMA Business Meeting is of full power as 28 of the 34 member societies are represented on the meeting.

The delegates unanimously approve the proposed agenda.

#### 2. Auditors' report

On behalf of the Auditing Committee elected by the 1st General Meeting Barbara Cressey reports: they have examined the accounts for the period February 1996 - July 1998. The auditors have ascertained that income and disbursements are as recorded. The major disbursements have been connected with the IMA meetings in Toronto and Strasbourg, while minor disbursements incurred in connection with important activities of the Commission on New Minerals and Mineral Names and organization of the Conference on Mineralogy and Museums. The auditors confirm that these outgoings have been fair and reasonable. The account balance at July 27, 1998 stood at \$34,593.40. They approve the account (also in writing).

## 3–4. Election of the Council and Officers of the Commissions and Working Groups for the period 1998–2002

The Secretary reports that according to the IMA Constitution, Articles 11, 12g and 13d, the Proposals for the Council and Officers of the Cs and Wgs were presented at the 1st Business Meeting and were listed on the Conference Board.

There was only one change noticed, concerning the Secretary of the Commission on Applied Mineralogy: instead of W. Petruk (Canada), Henrique Kahn (Brazil) was proposed.

Prof. I. Parsons invites the participants to take part at the next IMA General Meeting, in 2002, in Edinburgh (UK).

By closing the 2nd IMA Business Meeting the new President thanks all Delegates for being present and for giving their contribution to the meeting. He thanks the Organizing Committee, especially to John Rucklidge, for the efforts concerning the organization of the 17th IMA General Meeting.
